


*Apples and Pears need at least two trees of different varieties for pollination and production of fruit.

FRUIT, NUT & MUSHROOM VARIETIES



APPLES (NEED TWO DIFFERENT VARIETIES FOR CROSS-POLLINATION)

Cortland: Medium-large slightly ribbed dull red fruit with a purple blush have a slow-oxidizing white flesh which means they won't brown! The fine-grained, tart, crisp, juicy fruit is excellent for eating and cooking. Ripens mid-September. Mature height: 15-25 ft.; Plant Spacing: 12-15 ft.; Years to fruit: 3-5.

Gale Gala: Flesh has a simple sweetness with hints of vanilla. A great snacking apple and ideal for chopping and adding to a salad. Not ideal for baking. Ripens mid-August. Mature height: 15-25 ft.; Plant Spacing: 15 ft.; Years to fruit: 2-5.

Early Fuji: Interior creamy white flesh is dense, juicy, and crisp. Low in acid, the flavor is mild yet very sweet with hints of both honey and citrus. Great for baking and sauces. Ripens mid-August through September Mature height: 15-25 ft.; Plant Spacing: 12-15 ft.; Years to fruit: 2-5.

PEACH

Canadian Harmony: Firm, yellow, freestone flesh on the inside. Flesh is slow to brown, so it's good for salads. Also freezes well. The tree is vigorous, upright growing and hardy. Fruit ripens in mid-to-late August. Mature height: 15-18 ft.; Plant Spacing: 20 ft.; Years to fruit: 2-4.

PEAR (NEED TWO DIFFERENT VARIETIES FOR CROSS-POLLINATION)

Clapp's Favorite: Produces large, sun-yellow pears with a red cheek. Fruit is juicy with a fine sweet texture, ideal for fresh-eating and canning. Mature height: 20 ft.; Plant Spacing: 18-20 ft.; Years to fruit: 4-6.

Flemish Beauty: An old-fashioned eating pear with buttery flesh which was so highly prized in 19th century Europe. It has a rich sweet flavor. Ripens mid to late season. Mature height: 20 ft.; Plant Spacing: 18-20 ft.; Years to fruit: 4-6.

SWEET CHERRY

Lapins: This self-fruitful, Bing-type cherry produces large crops of delicious dark fruit nearly one inch in diameter. Its purplish red flesh is firm and sweet. Harvest from late June to early July. Mature height: 15-25 ft.; Plant Spacing: 15-20ft.; Years to fruit: 2-3.

PLUM (EARLY FROST & HEAVY RAIN CAN EFFECT FRUITING. TIGHT SPACING IS NEEDED FOR POLLINATION)

Italian Prune: Large, oblong purple fruits with succulent greenish-yellow flesh that turns red when cooked. Delicious fresh or dried. Excellent for sauces, preserves and wines; highly suited for canning. Harvest mid-to late-August. Mature height: 12-15 ft.; Plant Spacing: 6-8 ft.; Years to fruit: 3-6.

ASPARAGUS Jersey Giant: Produces medium to large (7-9 inch), green spears with purple tops. Mature Height: 3-4ft (ferns); Plant Spacing: 18-24 inches.; Years to harvest: 1.

BLACKBERRY Thornless Arapaho: Tall, erect canes yield extra-tasty blackberries with exceptionally small seeds. New canes come up from the roots to increase productivity. Summer-bearing floricanes. Early to mid-season. Ripens in mid June. Mature height: 4-5 ft.; Plant Spacing: 2.5-3 ft.; Years to fruit: 1-2.

ELDERBERRY Native: Giant clusters of white flowers bloom in spring, becoming soft, nearly black berries in late summer. Berries are roughly 1/4 inch in size. Both the elder flowers and the ripe elderberries are edible. Mature height: 10-15 ft.; Plant Spacing: 6 ft. Years to fruit: 2-3.

GOOSEBERRY Pixwell: Medium-sized pinkish berries have superb flavor. Delicious for fresh eating or for pies and jellies. Vigorous, bushy, almost thornless plants are very hardy and bear abundant fruit that ripen in July. Mature height: 3-4 ft. Plant Spacing: 4-5 ft. Years to bear: 1-2.

HAZELNUT American: Easy-to-crack shells with small, sweet kernel. Hazelnut hedges can be used as windbreaks, visual screens, and to attract wildlife. Ideally plant 2 or more shrubs to ensure a good crop. Mature height: 12 in; Plant Spacing: 6-8 ft.; Years to fruit: 1.

MUSHROOM Wine Cap: An easy to grow mushroom for the home garden. It looks like a portabello mushroom with a burgundy cap and purple gills. Grow in a 5ft x 5ft patch or wood chips. Can yield 5-15 lbs the first season. Established patches can "fruit" perennially with the addition of fresh wood chips.
